Air Canada Announces Appointment of Klaus Goersch as Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer

In this role he will have responsibility for the safe, reliable and cost-effective operation of the airline. In addition to being a qualified pilot, Mr. Goersch holds a Master of Aeronautical Science degree from Embry Riddle Aeronautical University, Florida.

Mr. Goersch will be based at the airline's Toronto hub, effective October 1, 2012.
