

Air Canada to re-introduce only direct weekly non-stop service between Montréal and Fort-de-France, Martinique

MONTREAL, Dec. 10 /CNW Telbec/ - Air Canada today announced the re-introduction of the only non-stop scheduled service between Montréal and Fort-de-France, Martinique. The weekly service will be initially offered on Saturdays during the summer between July 4, 2009 and August 29, 2009, and will recommence on a year-round service basis on December 5, 2009.
