Air Canada Receives Strike Notice from CUPE - Airline revises ticketing policy so customers can change bookings free of charge

MONTREAL, Sept. 16, 2011 /CNW Telbec/ - Air Canada has received a strike notice from the Canadian Union of Public Employees (CUPE), which represents the airline's 6,800 flight attendants, confirming the union's intention to begin a strike at 12:01 a.m. Wednesday, September 21, 2011.

Talks between the parties are ongoing and will continue prior to the strike deadline, assisted by federally-appointed mediators. However, in recognition of the uncertainty for customers this situation may cause, Air Canada has introduced a flexible rebooking policy to enable customers booked for travel over the next six days on a rolling window basis (September 16-21, 17-22, etc.) to change flights free of charge to a later date until December 9, 2011, subject to seat availability.

Customers wishing to change flights purchased directly through Air Canada are requested to use the on-line Self Service Rebooking Tool available at <u>www.aircanada.com</u>. Customers can also contact the AirCanada call centre, however wait times are longer than usual due to increased call volumes. Customers who booked travel through a travel agent must contact their agent directly.

In the event of a work disruption, Air Canada will implement a partial schedule including codeshare flights operated by its partner airlines.

The airline will provide further updates as developments warrant.
